The Signpost Programme is a Teagasc-led partnership of farmers and over 40 companies and organisations from across the Irish agriculture sector. The primary objective of the programme is to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by up to 15% by 2025 on the Signpost Farms and by 2030 for all farms. This represents an important first step in reducing GHG emissions from Irish agriculture.



Results of recent Teagasc Protected Urea Trial Published



A recent peer-reviewed paper has confirmed that no residues of either NBPT or NBPTo were found in any of over 500 milk samples taken from milk produced by cows fertilised with Protected Urea

As part of the Teagasc conducted research, a highly sensitive and validated analytical method for the detection of the urease inhibitor NBPT and NBPTo in the matrix of milk was developed by Teagasc researchers at its Ashtown campus.
